If you can answer **YES** to <u>ALL</u> the following, you may renew your passport by mail!

- I can submit my most recent US passport book and/or card with this application
- I was at least 16 years old when my most recent US Passport book and/or card was issued.
- I was issued my most recent US Passport book and/or card less than 15 years ago.
- The US Passport book and/or card that I am renewing has not been mutilated, damaged, or reported lost or stolen
- My US Passport was not limited to less than normal ten-year validity period due to passport damage/mutilation, multiple passport thefts/losses or non-compliance with 22 C.F.R. 51.41 (Refer to the last page of your US passport book for endorsement information.)
- My name has not changed since my most recent U.S. passport book and/or card was issued
