It is therefore declared that the said Stock Law has been carried within and for the territory above described at said election, and it is ordered that horses, mules, jacks, jennetts and cattle shall be prohibited from running at large within the territory above described efter thirty days from date hereof, and the proclamation carrying the law into effect.

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2. Consideration and Action to accept petition for Stock Law Election for the purpose of determining if cattle should be permitted to run at large in the unincorporated areas of Austin County.

Dan Leedy presented the Court with two sets of original petitions, one for cattle, and one for horses, hogs, sheep or goats. He said that the Secretary of State's office suggested having two separate petitions, since these come under different sections of the Agricultural Code. He explained that the stock law would be another tool that the Sheriff's Department could use to try to control animals running on the streets and roads in the county. If the stock law passes, the sheriff's department would be able to write a ticket to the owners of animals who knowingly let their animals run at large. The Stock Law would be put on the ballot for the May 1, 1999 election, the same time as the Unit Road System.
